This is very exciting, as it allows for the strengthening of brotherly bonds and the development of new memories that we will all cherish forever. The development of good character, academic success, and social bonds is made possible not only through the experiences we make with each other, but also the beautiful environment that we are privileged enough to call home.

This is only made possible through the generous donations and hard work put in by alumni. The men of Beta Theta Pi are forever grateful for these sacrifices, as it provides a space for the brothers of this Fraternity to truly excel in their academic studies and all other endeavors.

It is within the newly renovated Chapter House that we can find peace and quiet and catch up on academics in the new study rooms throughout the house. These rooms, coupled with the removal of the sleeping porch and beds, have drastically improved the quality of the time spent within the Chapter House. These new renovations have attracted older members to live-in longer; as for the younger members—they could not be more pleased. The current house capacity is 45, and we have filled the house with 43 bright young men.

Extracurriculars
